We are specifically looking to increase representation across our team, to better meet the needs of the audiences we serve. We already have a strong cast of female-identifying performers and want to ensure we better represent our audiences with a balanced cast.

We acknowledge that people of the global majority are currently underrepresented in our team, and therefore we particularly encourage applications from people who belong to the global majority. We are proud to hold ITC Ethical Manager status and are committed to actively listening to the needs of our team to ensure our working environment is equitable, inclusive, and supportive.

Both performances demand significant reliance on ensemble work and strength, as well as an ability to tell stories verbally and physically.

All team members are required to:

- Be willing to take part in all aspects of the performance making process, including the responsibility of set/costume and prop maintenance, and set building.
- Have an ability to be adaptable and be able to cope with changes demanded by each performance.
- Have a well-developed sense of humour and work closely as part of a team.
- Show a genuine care for their role and their commitment to making and delivering quality performance for children and young people.

Performers will have some training in physical performance, acting using script and narrative, and good experience in performing contemporary dance. Other desirable skills are aerial, climbing, gymnastics.

All applicants should consider the following:

- Have a high level of physical fitness, be strong and athletic.
- Be experienced in devising movement and storytelling and eager to learn new skills including aerial choreography and/or using Highly Sprung's flying rig.
- Be comfortable working and performing at height.
- Have an excellent ability to develop and present character through movement and text.
- Have great team skills and enjoy working closely with others
- MUST be available for ALL rehearsal dates and performance dates for the entire project.

#### The audition:

Selection will be based on the creativity and capability of performers. Open to any male-identifying and non-binary performer with an interest in physical movement and storytelling and making work for children and young people.

The audition will be an introduction to the performance making process and the stories being explored. It will also test team capabilities, strength, and playfulness. This day-long audition will include task-based ensemble activities, storytelling, improvisation, and choreography.
